THE ADDRESS

Frank Bisignano is Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer of Fiserv, Inc. (NYSE: FI), a global leader in payments and financial technology. Under his leadership, the company is advancing new capabilities and accelerating its growth by coupling innovation with scale and operational excellence, bringing modern solutions to financial institutions, businesses, and consumers. Today, Fiserv serves clients in more than 100 countries, leads the IDC FinTech Top 100 ranking of global financial technology providers, and has been recognized as one of Fortune® World's Most Admired Companies™ for nine of the last 10 years.

Combining his expertise in banking and payments with deep experience and conviction in the transformative power of technology, Bisignano architected the combination of Fiserv with First Data Corp. in 2019, initially leading the combined company's day-to-day operations as President and Chief Operating Officer before becoming Chief Executive Officer in July 2020 and Chairman of the Board in May 2022.

During his tenure at First Data, Bisignano transformed the company from the world's largest traditional payment processor into a technology innovator, industry collaborator, and commerce enabler for the 21st century. He also led its \$2.6 billion initial public offering in 2015, the largest U.S. IPO of the year.

Previously, Bisignano served as Co-Chief Operating Officer and Chief Executive Officer of Mortgage Banking at JPMorgan Chase & Co. and held multiple leadership positions at Citigroup.

Among a number of non-profit commitments, he serves on the boards of the National September 11 Memorial and Museum, the Mount Sinai Health System, and The Battery Conservancy, and is a member of Business Roundtable, a U.S.-based association of CEOs who use public policy to promote a thriving economy and expanded opportunities for Americans.

Bisignano is a professional and personal advocate for creating positive change in communities and has spearheaded multiple causes, including the Fiserv Back2Business program, a \$50 million commitment to support minority-owned small businesses.

He and his family are also personal supporters of the military and veteran community, including the Institute for Veterans and Military Families, the September 11 Memorial and Museum, and the Intrepid Sea, Air, and Space Museum.

Bisignano attended Baker University through 1979, studying business administration. At Baker, he was an active bowling team member, competing at the national level and receiving multiple accolades, including NAIA All-American.

Bisignano holds honorary doctorate degrees from Howard University, the New York Institute of Technology, St. Thomas Aquinas College, and Syracuse University.

THE UNIVERSITY

In the mid-1850s, a group of Methodist ministers sought refuge from the brutality of a territory torn by economic and social disagreement. It was decided that such a retreat could only be found in the presence of education. A sanctuary of culture and civility was planned, but it was not until the Palmyra Association made a considerable donation of land that Baldwin City was selected as the location for Kansas' first university. Named for Osmon C. Baker, the first American bishop of the Methodist Episcopal Church, Baker University was granted a charter by the territorial legislature on February 12, 1858.

Throughout its history, the university has produced educated contributors to all fields. Baker boasts four Rhodes Scholars, a Pulitzer Prize winner, and countless others who have made a lasting impact as explorers, clergymen, politicians, writers, and academics.

In the 166 years since its inception, Baker has evolved from a small university and preparatory school to a comprehensive university with four schools and degrees ranging from associate to doctorate. From the first graduating class of three in 1866, Baker now serves students across campuses in Kansas and online around the world. The College of Arts and Sciences offers undergraduate degrees in more than 30 areas of study on the Baldwin City campus. The School of Professional and Graduate Studies serves working adults with numerous online programs. At the School of Nursing, Baker partners with Stormont Vail Health in Topeka to offer bachelor's and master's degrees in nursing. The School of Education offers bachelor's, master's, and doctoral degrees in Baldwin City and online.

CLASS ORGANIZATIONS

Baker University's Class of 1891 began the tradition of naming itself and bequeathing its title to the incoming freshman class. Thus, each organization's name and traditions are passed on through generations. During any given year, four organizations are represented among the freshman, sophomore, junior, and senior classes: Columbian Commonwealth, Senatus Romanus, King Arthur's Court, and House of Hanover. The class of 2023 is part of House of Hanover, and the class of 2024 is part of Columbian Commonwealth. When the class of 2028 enters Baker in the fall, it will assume the traditions of Columbian Commonwealth.

These designations are applicable to baccalaureate degrees: Summa Cum Laude – With Highest Honors Magna Cum Laude - With High Honors Cum Laude - With Honors

THE ACADEMIC REGALIA

The pageantry and dress of the academic procession have been inherited from the medieval universities of the eleventh and twelfth centuries where academic life began, first in the Church, then in the guilds. Principal features of academic dress are the gown, the cap, and the hood.

The bachelor's gown has pointed sleeves. Sleeves of the master's degree gown are long and closed with a slit at the wrist. Doctoral gowns have full bell sleeves with three velvet chevrons across them and are faced with velvet. University presidents usually wear academic regalia that represents the school.

The colors of the hood generally represent the school and discipline. Traditional colors associated with disciplines are Maize, Agriculture; White, Arts, Letters, and Humanities; Drab, Accounting and Business; Copper, Economics; Light Blue, Education; Orange, Engineering; Brown, Fine Arts; Russet, Forestry; Crimson, Journalism; Purple, Law; Lemon, Library Science; Green, Medicine; Pink, Music; Apricot, Nursing; Silver Gray, Speech; Dark Blue, Philosophy; Sage Green, Physical Education; Golden Yellow, Science; Citron, Social Work; Scarlet, Theology.

THE UNIVERSITY SYMBOLS

In 166 years, Baker has developed many rich traditions. Along with these traditions came a series of symbols holding special meaning to the university and its rituals.

The Presidential Medallion was first worn on April 22, 1967, by Baker President James E. Doty for his inauguration. A gift from Doty's alma mater, Mount Union College in Ohio, the sterling silver and gold medallion is worn by university presidents during ceremonial events, such as commencement and convocation, to signify the official authority and responsibility of the president.

The Baker University seal was added as a university symbol when the university celebrated its golden anniversary. Its Latin motto translates "Let him first be a man," adding to the display of three Greek words: mind, body, and soul. At the center is the lamp of learning on the open book of knowledge.

The Baker University mace symbolizes the power and authority of learning. Commissioned for the 1974 inauguration of Baker's 24th president, Jerald C. Walker, Walt Bailey, emeritus faculty member whose career at Baker spanned 42 years as a professor of art, created the mace from remnants of Baker's Centenary Hall and historic Parmenter Hall. Bearing the name of Baker's 29 presidents, the mace is carried in the procession of official university ceremonies by the Grand Marshal. The traditional symbol was derived from a battle instrument of the knights in the Middle Ages.

FLAGS

The flags represent the countries of origin of our graduating students and faculty. This year we have flags representing Antigua and Barbuda, Colombia, Hungary, Nigeria, and Romania.

DISTINGUISHED ALUMNI ACHIEVEMENT AWARD

The Distinguished Alumni Achievement Award recognizes Baker University alumni who have made exceptional contributions in their professional fields and their communities since graduating. They have demonstrated remarkable leadership skills and serve as role models for current and future alumni. Their unwavering commitment to Baker University is evident in their continued support of and involvement with the university.

KOPKE AWARD

The Jennie Howell Kopke and Verda R. Kopke Award for Distinguished Teaching recognizes annually a Baker faculty member who has a record of excellence in teaching and in transforming students into scholars, who brings honor to the university, and who exhibits good moral character.

JABARA LEADERSHIP AWARD

The Jabara Leadership Award recognizes one graduating male and one graduating female student who demonstrate leadership, academic excellence, departmental involvement, and career potential while completing their degree at Baker.
